

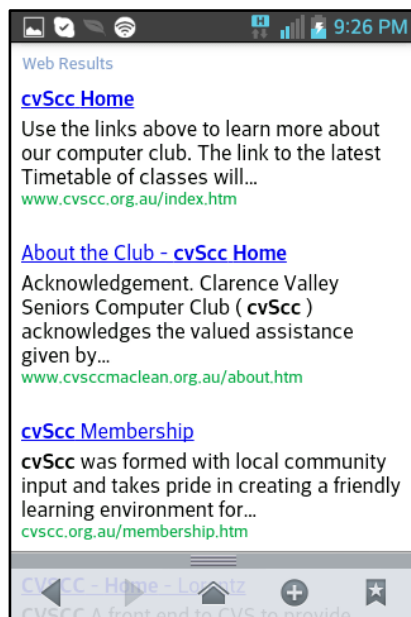
Android for Beginners 4

If you visit the same websites often then it could be a good idea to Bookmark them so that you can just tap and go there again.

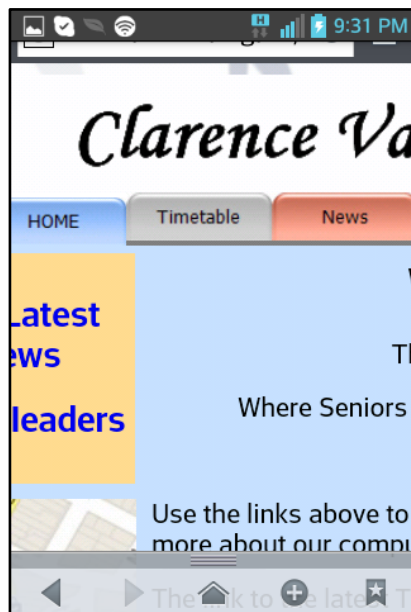
Let's find a website for this exercise

Using your Search app type in cvScc.

Look in the search results for the link to the cvScc website and tap it



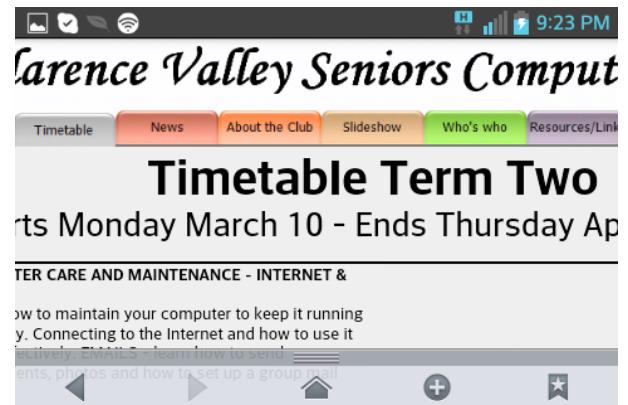
When the website opens look for Timetable tab near the top of the page



If the writing is too small then you could try a double tap to enlarge it, if that

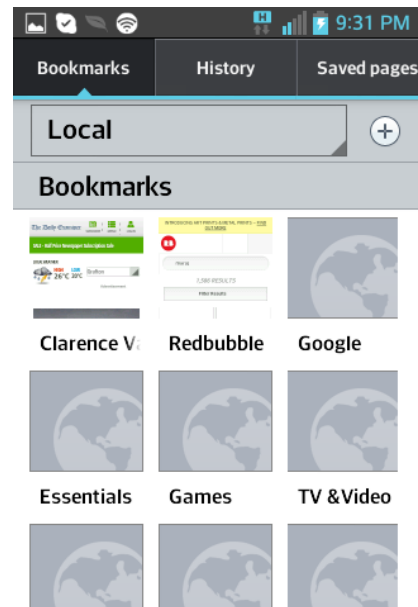
doesn't work then try a tap with two fingers and open them to make the page bigger and easier to read

Now tap the Timetable tab



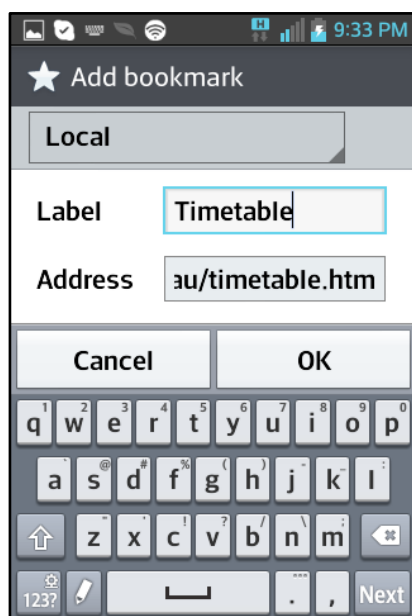
Turn your device to the landscape orientation to get a better view

Notice the Bookmark button in the bottom right corner and tap it

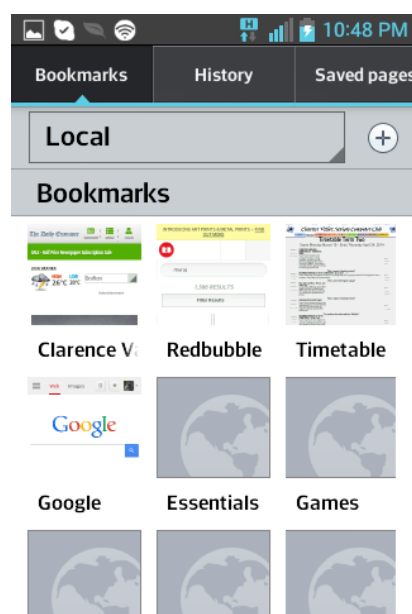


In this new page tap the Plus (+) sign near the top

The details of the page you were viewing will already be entered, tap OK



You will notice a new bookmark has appeared and you can see that it is labeled Timetable

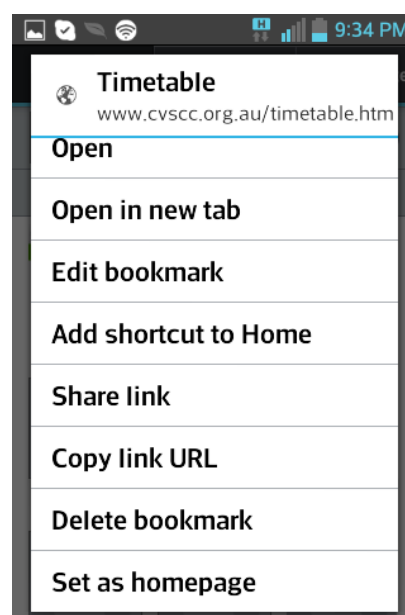


At the bottom of the browser page there is a toolbar – it is where the Bookmark button is showing.

The other buttons are Back, Forward, Home and a plus symbol which adds new pages to the browser.

The toolbar can be dragged up or down to show or hide it.

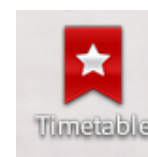
Do a long tap on this new bookmark



Notice the options available bookmarks

Tap the option to *Add shortcut to Home*

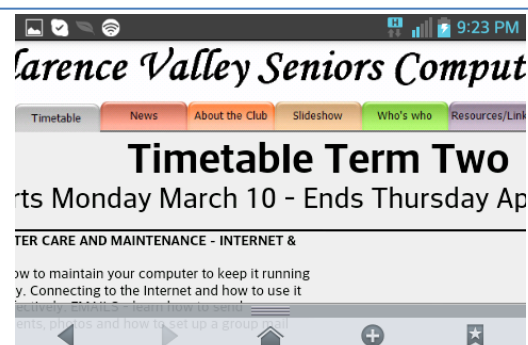
Tap the Home button and move to the page showing the new bookmark, it will look like this:



Now let's make another bookmark; this time choose your most visited website, mine is the Daily Examiner

When you have a number of bookmarks you could combine them in the one folder, just tap and drag and drop one of them over the top of another one.

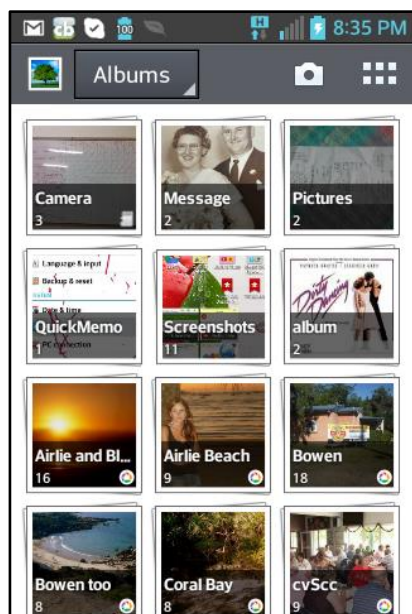
Using bookmarks in this way means you just have to tap the bookmark and your browser will open and then show the page that the bookmark was set to open.



When you take pictures on your device you can copy them to your computer using the cable that came with the device or wirelessly using an app.

Another way is to use the Share feature. Today we will copy a picture to the computer by sharing via email.

Tap the Gallery app and the gallery opens showing the pictures you have taken



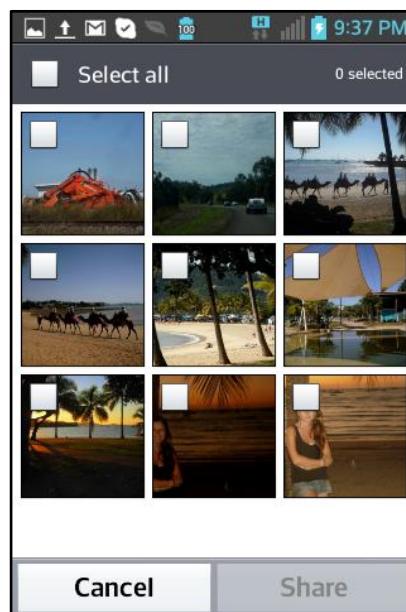
If the pictures are in groups (Albums) then tap one of the albums to see all the pictures inside the album



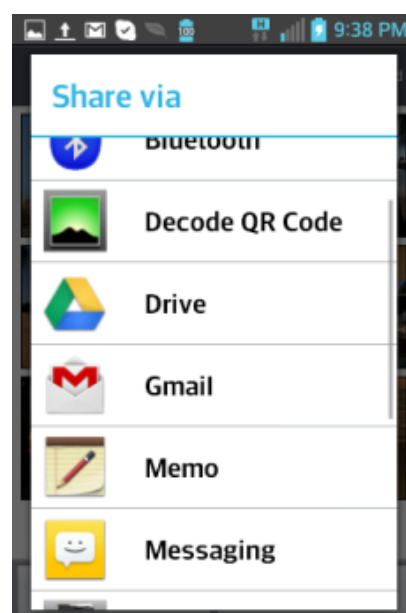
Notice the Share symbol near the top of the page



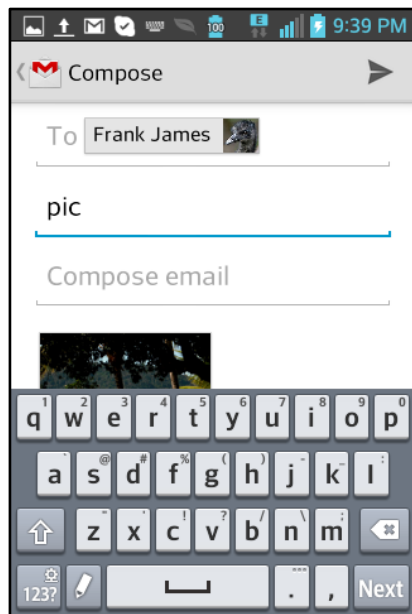
Tap the Share symbol and if there are a few pictures then little selection boxes will appear on each picture. Put a tick in each picture you are going to share



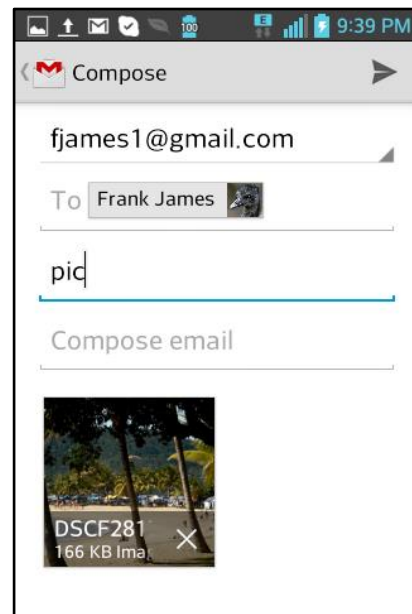
Tap the Share box at the bottom of the page and a list of the available ways to share appears



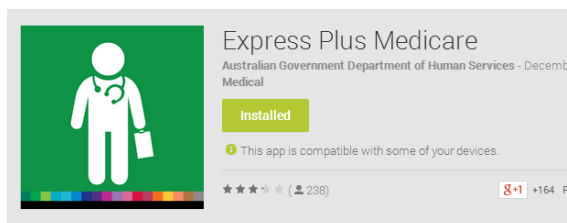
The most often ways to share here are Gmail and Messaging. If you have Google Drive and/or Drop Box set up then they will be here too. Let's try Gmail for now



The Gmail app opens with the picture already inserted. Type the email address you use on your computer and then send the email

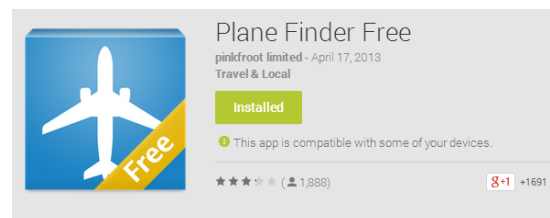


Apps to try
